OPERATIONAL CONTEXT:

The humanitarian crisis in the Central African Republic (CAR) continues.

- In 2024, 2.4 million people, or 38% of the population, are in need of humanitarian aid and protection, a decrease from 3.4 million in 2023.
- This includes 913,000 people whose needs are so severe that their physical and mental well-being is at risk.
- Although large-scale clashes have decreased, violence against civilians persists, and livelihoods continue to deteriorate, particularly due to ongoing forced displacements.

WHAT WE DO:



DCA CAR, with the commitment of **civil society, democratic authorities, and a responsible private sector**, seeks to create a peaceful environment for all communities, enabling them to access their rights and benefit equitably and inclusively from socio-economic resources, while also considering environmental protection. DCA aims to achieve this objective by acting on multiple levels, supporting individuals and communities, and intervening at regional and national levels.



DCA provides **psychosocial support services and protection**, strengthens the capacities of local NGOs and civil society organizations, and coordinates with other organizations to maximize the effectiveness of its actions. It works closely with women, youth, and the most marginalized groups.



While DCA aims to support vulnerable communities with **a comprehensive response**, it also specializes in food security and livelihoods through projects that use cash transfers as a distribution mechanism and promote innovative and sustainable agriculture.

Conflict Prevention and Peacebuilding:

- Implementation and strengthening of community networks and organizations.
- Development of local security plans.
- Conflict mitigation and security micro-projects.
- Income-generating activities for women and youth.
- Capacity building for community leaders and local authorities on peacebuilding mechanisms.
- Community-based psychosocial support.
- Awareness sessions and training on conflict resolution and social cohesion.

Emergency Response and Recovery:

- Use of cash to ensure basic needs are met.
- Support for improved and sustainable agriculture.
- Income-generating activities and vocational training for youth.
